1. Highlights / main achievements

EIARD noticeable achievements in 2009 (since last ECG, in nov 2008) are:

- Approval of EIARD strategy for 2009-1013, clarifying its goal, purpose, guiding principles, and 4 main fields of activities for the next 4 years (effective coordination of European ARD polivcies in the pursuit of the MDGs; Effective coordination of European investment in the CGIAR; Effective coordination of European investments in strengthening ARD organisations at global and continental and sub continental levels, especially in Africa; effective coordination between European investments in ARD and investments in rural development in pursuit of the MDGs; + crosscutting outputs)
- Initiation of the implementation of the FSTP EIARD Project : "fostering European aid effectiveness for Agricultural Research for Development". Thanks to an EC financial contribution (1300 k€) granted to GTZ (6 activities completed, and 3 on going ; see table in annex)
- Efficient coordination of European positions regarding the CGIAR reform process, giving them more relevance and acceptance by the CG Secretariat and the Alliance
- Support provided to the European Gcard consultations
- Support to the formulation of the PAEPARD II project, soon to be presented for funding.

2. Staff and meetings

These results have been achieved through:

- the time, energy and expertise dedicated to EIARD by all its members, and especially those participating to the EIARD Working Group and other Eiard meetings
- a regular exchange of information, especially by email, between the members
- the dedication of its Executive Secretary and chairman ,Jonathan Wadsworth
- the financial support form the EC and from several Member states

The position of Executive Secretary of Eiard has been held by Jean-Luc Khalfaoui, who very efficiently assumed this role until the end of his official assignment, in may 2009. The responsibility was then passed to David Radcliffe, from DG DEV, who remarkably succeeded in maintaining an adequate coordination of Eiard while continuing his other commitments. The replacement of JLK, Philippe Petithuguenin (END seconded by the French government). has taken its post at DG RTD on November 1rst, and there will be a progressive hand over of responsabilities between DR and PP,

Thanks and congratulations to JLK and DR for job done. Welcome to PhP

Five Eiard meetings were held in 2009, before the ECG 15. Another one may be added before the end of 2009. There were 3 officials meetings of the Eiard WG: WG44, in February in Rome,; WG 45 in May in Brussels, WG 46 in October in Brussels. Two informal meetings were also organised, both about the CG reform: one in London in May, and one in Rome in November (before the ExCo17)

Another informal meeting may be organised in Washington, on Dec 7 or 8, between the Eiard members participating to the CG "business meeting". It would help to exchange information and align European positions before their encounter with the Alliance and the other donors.

The Project Management Team of the EIARD – FSTP project has also met formally in Eschborn in March 2009. Another meeting of this PMT is scheduled for the 25 th Nov 2009.
